

Ride Mile A Minute On Errand Of Mercy

10/19/1924

Highway Policemen Carry Instrument to Dover in 45 minutes.

To save the life of a child who was slowly choking to death with diphtheria Highway Policemen Carpenter and Ritter made a run from the office to Dr. W. O. LaMotte to Dover with a life saving tube yesterday in 45 minutes.

Yesterday morning a call was received from the office of Dr. Middlerose in Dover that unless the tube was obtained the child would die. He suggested that it be obtained from Dr. LaMotte and brought to him as soon as possible. Although this was out of their line of work the two policemen got busy and in one hour and fifteen minutes from the time the message was received the men were at the doctor's office.

The ride was an exciting one. Tooting the horns on their motorcycles to warn all vehicles of their approach and to make known that they wanted the right of way the men sped along at the rate of a mile a minute. Sometimes their speed exceeded this and other times they were compelled to slacken their speed because of the congestion of traffic. However, they arrived in time to save the child's life.

Prisoners Kneel In Prayer When Captured

Garmock And Smolka Held On Charge Of Transporting Liquor

State Troopers Ray and Sullivan while at Station No. 1 on Penny Hill, late Saturday night, arrested Joseph Garmock and Konstanty Smolka on a charge of transporting liquor, and seized a keg containing about 15 gallons of alleged liquor, and a Ford truck. A third man, said to be the driver of the car, escaped through a corn field. When arraigned before Magistrate Jones this morning both men were held on \$500 bail for the General Sessions Court.

Ray and Sullivan first noticed the truck proceeding along the Philadelphia pike toward the station with only one headlight burning. After ordering the driver to stop, the car continued for nearly a hundred yards. The two troopers arrived just as one of the men jumped a fence and darted across the field. Ray gave chase.

Sullivan proceeded to search the machine and when he opened the door both Smolka and Garmock toppled on him. The three men rolled from the roadside into a ditch and when Sullivan recovered his bearings, he said, both his prisonners was kneeling in front of him praying.
